RETAIL CREDITOR ADVISORY BULLETIN

Increased Documentary Fee Effective September 5, 2013

Senate Bill 1248

Earlier this year, the Texas Legislature passed a bill, SB 1248, that repeals the \$50 limitation on the documentary fee that may be charged by retail creditors under Texas Finance Code, Chapter 345. SB 1248 states that the Finance Commission may set by rule a reasonable maximum amount for the documentary services that may be charged in a retail installment transaction for the purchase of a motorcycle, motor-driven cycle, moped, all-terrain vehicle, boat, boat motor, boat trailer, or towable recreational vehicle.

Documentary Fee Rule

The Finance Commission has adopted a new rule setting the reasonable maximum amounts that may be charged by Chapter 345 retail creditors in a retail installment transaction. The new rule will be located in Texas Administrative Code, Title 7, Section 86.201.

- For a retail installment contract for the purchase of one or more covered land vehicles (i.e., wheeled vehicles listed above), the reasonable maximum documentary fee is \$125.
- For a retail installment contract for the purchase of one or more covered watercraft (i.e., boat or boat motor), the reasonable maximum documentary fee is \$125.
- For a retail installment contract for the purchase of at least one covered land vehicle AND at least one covered watercraft, the reasonable maximum documentary fee is \$175.

Effective Date

The new rule will go into effect on September 5, 2013, and will be available online as of that date (www.sos.state.tx.us). The increased documentary fee may not be charged before September 5.
